

HUMBOLDT AREA FOUNDATION SUGGESTED SCHOLARSHIP TIMELINE



SEPTEMBER

-Ask for two letters of recommendation from teachers who know you well and can advocate on your behalf. Committee members enjoy reading letters of recommendation from community members, so if you have been employed or have done volunteer work we recommend submitting a letter from someone who has worked with you.

OCTOBER

-Submit your FAFSA!
-Draft your personal statement, which must be 600 words about your goals, personality, and perseverance. Have at least two people proofread your essay!

NOVEMBER

-Create lists of all of the extracurricular activities, awards, employment, and volunteer work; make sure to include dates and hours of each activity.

DECEMBER

Go to fafsa.ed.gov or collegeboard.org to find out the expenses of your top choice college. The application will require you to state how much your tuition, room/board, books and travel will be.

JANUARY

-Request a PDF of your Transcript
-January 15 Humboldt Area Foundation scholarships become available on hafoundation.org.

FEBRUARY

-Listen to the school bulletin for when HAF will be coming to your school to do a workshop. On the day of the workshop bring:

- 2 letters of recommendation in PDF
- Official transcript in PDF
- Copy of Expected Family Contribution in PDF (this is provided in the Student Aid Report)
- Personal statement in PDF
- A list of all activities and dates (community service, awards, employment etc.)
- Estimated college expenses

MARCH

-March 15 the application is DUE!

STUDENT WORKBOOK

When applying for Humboldt Area Foundation Scholarships it is helpful to keep track of your accomplishments. We will be requesting this information on your scholarship application.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Indicate which Dates you served, the Community Project, describe your Participation, the number of Hours you served and whether this was volunteer (V) or required (R) by your school or by the justice system.

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ESSAY REQUIREMENTS

PERSONAL STATEMENT

Compose **Personal Statement Prompt (up to 600 words)**: Why is going to college important to you? How would receiving this scholarship help you achieve your goals? How have your life experiences influenced why you want to go to college and/or what you want to study? Describe a time you worked hard towards a goal and what you learned from that experience. How did you grow? How will this help you in the future?

Tips:

- Have at least two people proof read your Personal Statement.
- Committee members often mention that students are too modest with their accomplishments; it's okay to be proud of your accomplishments and aspirations.

FINANCIAL NEED STATEMENT

Please include a brief statement describing your financial need. Be sure to describe any financial hardships endured by you and your family that will make it difficult to afford your education. Do you have family members who plan to contribute toward the cost of your education? Do you have other family members attending college simultaneously? Describe any extraordinary expenses you and your family may have.

Tip:

- If you are applying for scholarships based on financial need, we recommend writing at least 3 paragraphs.
- If you do not qualify for a large FAFSA award please describe the financial reasons you'll need a scholarship.
- If you are unable to file FAFSA, please upload a statement explaining why when you are asked to upload your SAR (Student Aid Report).
